


Leave a legacy for learning in Wales

Leaving a legacy

If you are thinking about leaving a gift to the Society, it is your choice to decide how your gift will support learning in Wales.

Unrestricted gifts offer us the greatest flexibility to allocate your support carefully to an area of most need. If you are planning to leave a legacy for a specific purpose, we would be delighted to discuss this with you and to help with the wording of your will.

There are many ways to leave a gift in your will. You can give:

- A share of your estate (known as a residuary legacy)
- A fixed sum of money (a pecuniary legacy)
- Land, buildings or other possessions

If you have already made a will, it is very easy to make an addition (known as a codicil).

For estates greater than the inheritance tax threshold of £325,000, your estate will have the benefit of not paying 40% tax on your gift to the Society.
